Food for thought from J

According to the Merriam-Webster dictionary, the first three definitions of the word "gospel" are, in order:

- 1. "The message concerning Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation."
- 2. "One of the first four New Testament books telling of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ."
- 3. "An interpretation of the Christian message."

Clearly, as the first two definitions suggest, the central theme of all four gospels is Jesus and his life. Matthew and Mark make this proclamation in the first verse of their gospels, and while Luke and John take a little longer, both make it clear, before the end of chapter one, that what follows will be focused on the person and life of Jesus.

It is when we look at the third dictionary definition of "gospel," however, that an interesting observation emerges. While Jesus, as God incarnate, is, undeniably, the whole point of the gospels, the "Christian message" that is referenced in the above, third definition is often delivered to us through the actions, both good and bad, of the people who surrounded Jesus in his earthly life and ministry. What this means is that, while the events in the lives of Mary and Joseph certainly teach us more about the nature of Jesus and the providential work of God guiding them in a way that will ensure the safety and the proper upbringing of the Christ-child, they also provide us with an example of what it looks like when real, ordinary people listen faithfully to and obey God - regardless of the hardship and difficulty this obedience may entail. Likewise, people like the wise men, Simeon, Anna, and of course, the disciples, all provide these same studies in faithfulness that we would do well to consider in our lives today.

All of which leads to our roles as modern-day disciples of Christ. It is critical we realize that the purpose of our discipleship is not just so that we might live better and more Christ-like lives ourselves. Rather, it is through our living of Christ centered lives that we will serve as modern day witnesses to Jesus, so that those who do not yet have a personal and life changing relationship with him might be drawn to Christ through us, by the power of the Holy Spirit. And so, isn't it wonderful that, as modern-day disciples and witnesses to Christ, we can choose to join with the likes of Mary and Joseph, and all the others in continuing to be one of the means through which the good news of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ is communicated to a world that is desperate need of this message?

May we all join together faithfully in taking our place in the history of Christ's church and sharing the gospel through the way we live out the example of Christ every day.
