Food for thought from J

With our observance of Ash Wednesday this week, we have officially entered the season of Lent, those 40 days (not including Sundays) that lead up to Easter. While we often talk about "giving things up" for Lent, what does this mean and why do we do it?

Well, Lent is a season of preparation for celebrating Easter and remembering that the cornerstone of our Christian faith, our risen savior, literally gave up his own life so that all who believe in him might not perish, but have eternal life. While Christians around the world have, historically, chosen many ways to observe Lent, it is most customary, for those seeking to honor the sacrifice of Jesus, to temporarily "give up" something of value in their lives as a means of demonstrating their own sacrificial spirits. Subsequently, giving up favorite foods, social media, or watching television are popular sacrifices made by observers of Lent.

In addition to giving things up, however, it is also appropriate to <u>add</u> a spiritual practice to our routines as a means of preparing for Easter during this season. This might include joining a Bible study, undertaking a Lenten devotional program, or simply committing to begin every day in prayer and contemplation of Christ's sacrifice for us. If you have not decided on how you will prepare for Easter in 2023, I encourage you to consider the message of Matthew's gospel, and its call to true repentance, as a first step on the road to discipleship. We all continue to struggle with sin in our lives, and taking the time, daily, to pray for the strength to finally put aside that sinful way of acting, talking, or thinking, may help us be more prepared to receive the message of Easter than laying off chocolate or Facebook.

Regardless of how you may be led to observe Lent this year, though, I hope you will make Mossy Creek UMC a central part of your life as we join together as Easter people.
