## Food for thought from J

It is not uncommon for some to view the administrative activities of the church as a distraction from our mission of proclaiming the gospel and helping others. For sure, unhealthy focus on money or facilities can occur if we allow it. But I believe attending responsibly to the business of our church is not only an important usage of our spiritual gifts (that include the gift of administration – see 1 Corinthians 12:28 and Romans 12:8), but also, it gives us a regular opportunity to "count our blessings," as the old hymn encourages. To this end, and after our recent Church Council meeting, I feel called to lift up and thank God for the more "administrative and numerical" blessings our church enjoys - beginning with our lay leadership. We should all give thanks for our dedicated lay leaders who give selflessly of their time and talents to ensure church resources are managed prudently and in accordance with God's will. I am humbled to work with such a devoted group of Christians who are truly committed to supporting the role our church plays within the body of Christ.

Similarly, we should all be thankful for the vitality our church exhibits in the key areas of finance, member engagement, and missional focus. Thanks to your financial stewardship, Mossy Creek finished 2022 with surpluses in our general operating fund and our building fund. These surpluses will allow us to pursue new ministries in 2023 and to complete the final tasks associated with opening our new building and integrating it into the mission of the church. And speaking of our new building, this is another of those special "administrative" blessings with which God has entrusted us. It is exciting to look forward to the ways this facility will contribute to our future outreach and fellowship opportunities.

Membership growth and worship attendance are two more areas where our blessings can be measured numerically. In 2022, church membership (after deaths and transfers out) increased by 8, thanks to 6 new members by confirmation and 11 by transfer of membership. This was our first year of net membership growth since 2019 and the largest growth since 2009. Our worship attendance trends are also encouraging. Average in-person worship attendance was 86 for 2022, compared with 70 in 2021, and average attendance so far in 2023 has continued to rise to 95 compared with an average of 55 for the same period in 2022. Online viewing trends are also up in 2023, to a weekly average of 114 views versus 53 for the same period in 2022. The recent upgrades to our streaming capabilities and our mossycreekumc.org website should further enhance our ability to reach even more people through these important technologies. Membership engagement in other church activities has also remained strong. Our new Sunday school and mid-week Bible study classes provide important Christian education opportunities to 15+ people per week, collectively, and our United Methodist Women's and Men's groups are thriving as important sources of Christian education and fellowship.

Finally, our commitment to missions and outreach has remained strong. Our support, in 2022, of such important ministries as Family Promise and Wayne's World continued to demonstrate our commitment to meeting a variety of needs in our community. Furthermore, last year's successful VBS, Fall festival, and Children's Christmas play show our willingness to engage meaningfully with those children who are the future of our church.

Now obviously, we still have challenges to face and more to accomplish. But what a wonderful thing it is to consider the future Mossy Creek in the light of such blessings as those mentioned above. May we all continue to give thanks to God for these blessings and pray without ceasing for God's divine guidance and providence in the life of Mossy Creek UMC.
