Food for thought from J

"Celebrating" Holy Week can be a tricky thing. I mean, we know, as 21st century students of the Bible that, from the start, the adulation and cries of "Hosanna" Jesus received during his triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday would soon turn to shouts for him to be crucified, and his own people would call for a criminal named Barabbas to be released from prison rather than Jesus. So, what is there to celebrate?

We know that even as Jesus shared a last supper with his closest friends, bestowed on them the final lessons they would need to carry on his mission after he was gone, and prepared to submit faithfully to the perfect plan of God, those same friends and disciples would all abandon him, and even deny they knew him at all in the hours ahead. Ultimately, we know that he would be unjustly accused, tortured, and executed in one of the most horrendous ways imaginable – crucifixion. And even though we know Easter morning is coming and with that, our hope of resurrection into eternal life, as we consider the week leading up to that miraculous day – what is there to celebrate?

Well, we can begin by celebrating that we don't have to be like those first Palm Sunday crowds who turned on Jesus when he failed to meet their expectations of a Messiah. Rather, we can rejoice in our understanding of our radical Messiah and his radical message that greatness in the eyes of God is not defined by how much power we wield or how much worldly success we achieve, but by how we love and serve those around us. On Maundy Thursday, we can celebrate the gift of Holy Communion and the ongoing opportunity Christ himself offers for us to join with him and all the saints around his table to receive God's grace as we remember his unwavering faithfulness in the face of his impending betrayal. On Good Friday, we can celebrate with awe, the love of Christ in going humbly to the cross, giving up his own life so those who believe in him might not perish but have eternal life. And on Easter Sunday we can come together as a church to proclaim that "HE IS RISEN – HE IS RISEN INDEED!"

I hope you will join our church family this Sunday as we celebrate that Christ the Lord is risen, Hallelujah, Amen.
