Food for thought from J

HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

As Christians we proclaim boldly these words affirming our belief in the resurrected Christ. Subsequently, we are changed by our faith in Christ's victory over death. We draw strength and comfort from this greatest event in history and acknowledge that, in his resurrection, we have the same hope and promise of resurrection into eternal life, now and in the world to come. The apostle Paul may have said it best in Romans 6:4-5:

... just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

Yet, despite this wonderful promise, as we discussed Sunday, the desire to deny the resurrection goes back to that first Easter morning, and it continues today. In the 1980s and 90s, a group of so-called biblical scholars calling themselves the Jesus Seminar, concluded that, despite centuries of tradition and study from the greatest theologians of history, the resurrection was neither a probable nor a necessary component of our faith. More remarkable is the number of professing Christians who agreed with this group. In fact, a 2017 BBC poll found that 25% of professing Christians shared these conclusions and did not believe in the bodily resurrection of Christ. How can this be?

For sure, some honestly struggle with the supernatural concept of a bodily resurrection. It is a challenge to their sensibilities to accept something so clearly beyond the scope of the normal, scientific world in which we live. But I believe most reluctance to accept the full truth of the gospel message, including the resurrection, stems from the same source that motivated those Jewish leaders from Matthew's gospel to concoct the story and tell the community that Jesus was not resurrected, but rather, his disciples had stolen his body. From the beginning of his ministry, those first century leaders recognized and feared the existential threat to their power and control over the people that was posed by Jesus. Furthermore, they knew this threat would be overwhelming if he was proven to be who he claimed to be by virtue of something as remarkable as rising from the dead, and they were not willing to take that chance.

As Christians, we face this same perceived threat to control over our own lives by the authority and lordship of Jesus that is so apparent in the resurrection. When confronted with the reality that Christ was truly victorious even over death and we are not changed completely by what this means about his legitimate claim to lordship over our lives, we also demonstrate denial of the gospel, the lordship of Christ, and yes, even the resurrection. In our society that places such emphasis on personal freedom and liberty, it is understandable that we are reluctant to relinquish our self-rule in exchange for serving a risen savior. But the sooner we embrace the reality and the cosmic implications of the resurrection, the sooner we will find the courage to live the lives of radical love and self-sacrifice exemplified by the one who defeated death itself. The risen Christ. Hallelujah.
