Food for thought from J

Like it or not, disappointment is a real and unavoidable fact of life. As I witness regularly with my grandsons, it begins early and often with anger over not getting our way, no matter how much of a tantrum we throw. Over the years, as our capacity for disappointment evolves and matures, we experience it in such forms as not getting everything we asked for on our Christmas list, being turned down for dates and, ultimately, more adult concerns over missed job or career opportunities.

While the above disappointments are generally minor and short-lived though, imagine the disappointment of those early followers of Jesus immediately after the crucifixion and before the resurrected Christ was revealed to them. For them, the death of Jesus they had witnessed or heard about would have been a life shattering event causing faith shaking disappointment. Those who had decided to follow Jesus had done so with dreams of being on the ground floor of a new world order that included the overthrow of Roman oppression, the re-establishment of Israel to the glory it had enjoyed under King David, and with their fortunes rising along with those of the nation. With the death of Jesus, however, those dreams were shattered in an instant, and replaced by the fear of being persecuted and punished, just for being among those who had once held those dreams. When you think about it like that, disappointment hardly seems an appropriate word to describe what those first disciples of Christ may have been feeling.

Thank God, then, for the resurrection which not only took away the disappointment of those first century disciples, but which should also ease the pain and uncertainty of our own more personal and minor disappointments. With the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ, God demonstrated the divine commitment to a plan that would stop at nothing to draw us back into a perfect, loving and trusting relationship with God – even the physical agony of the cross. Furthermore, as the familiar song promises – "Because he lives, I can face tomorrow" – which means we can all face the uncertainty and even the disappointments of life because of God's unwavering love and commitment to our future in according to God's perfect plan.

May the perfect power and goodness of God, that shines forth in the miracle of the resurrection, ease our own, inevitable pain and disappointment, as we face uncertain days because Christ lives.
